

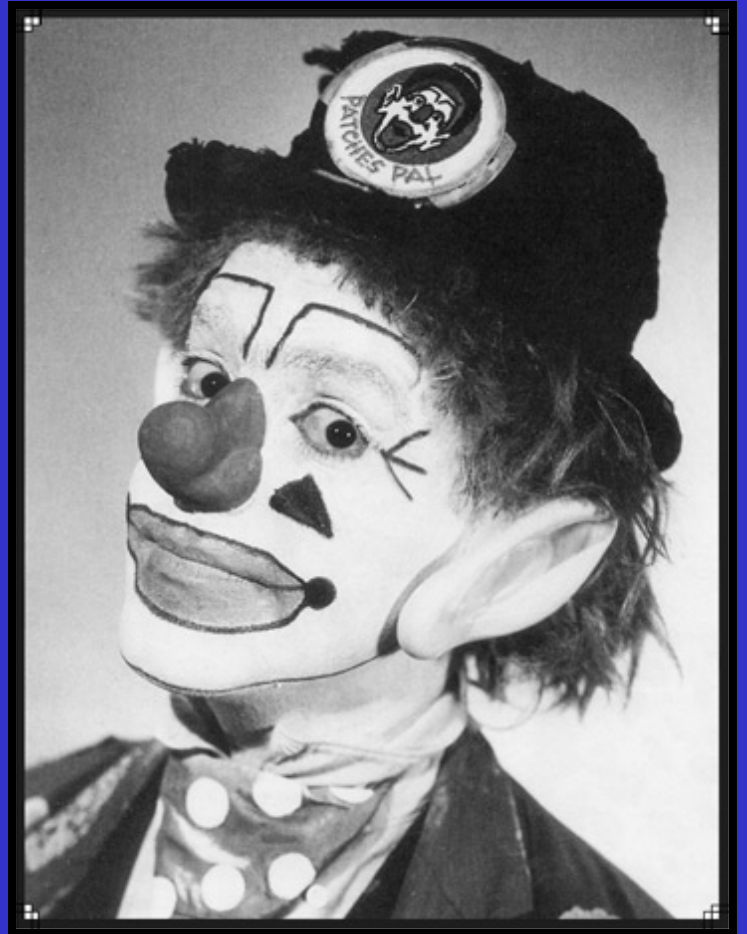
J.P. Patches

To a child growing up near Puget Sound in the 60s and 70s, appearing on the J.P. Patches Show was one of the requirements of a full life (right up there with visiting Disneyland). If you weren't on the show, the next best thing was meeting J.P. in person (and thanks to the generous and indefatigable J.P., there were plenty of opportunities). It's something that every Patches Pal remembers as a highlight of their childhood (again, this should concern you).

J.P.'s show outlasted other children's programs on the air and in the memories of his viewers.

While the kids loved the cluttered set, the wild cast of supporting characters and the slapstick antics of J.P., many of the jokes were only caught by the parents. The show was known for its energetic and occasionally sophisticated humor.

The Emmy winning J.P. Patches Show aired for 23 years on KIRO TV and at one time had an viewership of over 100,000. When it left the air in 1981, it was the longest running, locally produced children's program in the country.
